My garage was overflowing with boxes packed with household goods. Cabinets were empty; walls were bare. In three days, furniture would be shrink-wrapped and loaded onto a moving van. I would close on the sale of my house in Corpus Christi, TX.

On the last Sunday before my 700-mile move, my church family lovingly laid hands on me and prayed for a smooth and successful trip to relocate in Fort Smith, Arkansas.

Returning to my seat, a fellow-believer said to me, "Delores, your trip will be smooth, but there will be some potholes. Remember, they will be small potholes and God will fill them for you." Several times in the next few days these words were a great source of encouragement.

I had to remain extremely focused between January 10 and January 12. In the framework of 72 hours, I would close the sale of one house, drive to Arkansas, close on the purchase of another house, and move in. I was excited but also a little nervous.

On the day before closing on my Corpus Christi house, the first pothole appeared with an early morning phone call from my brother-in-law, Mark, in Oklahoma City. He had graciously offered to fly to Corpus Christi and drive the moving van to Fort Smith. The plan was for him to pick up the 26-foot truck in Corpus Christi at 9:30 a.m., but bad weather pushed his estimated arrival time to noon. Professional movers were scheduled to arrive at 10:30 a.m. to start the loading process. I had only a short time to call in another person to bring the moving van to my house. But God turned this event into only a small bump. After three or four phone calls and kindness from the truck company, I was able to arrange for the big yellow van to be delivered to my address before the loading crew arrived. God had smoothed over "pothole" #1.

Pothole #2 was discovered the next morning. Mark parked the locked truck at the home of James's sister, Becky, and her husband, John, where we spent the night. As I was getting ready for the 8:30 a.m. house closing, I heard Mark and Becky talking very seriously about something. Coming downstairs, they told me the lock on the truck had been removed. Would I come to check inside to see if anything was missing? Thankfully, everything was there. We'll never know the details, but God stationed his warring angels around that truck protecting all my earthly possessions from danger and loss!


obvious in every detail!
